
The First Written Document Found

• First Turkish written document found waas Orkhon İnscriptions. The Orkhon inscriptions, (also known as Orhon Inscriptions) are two memorial tablet erected by the Göktürks written in Old Turkic alphabet in the early 8th century in the Orkhon Valley in Mongolia. They were erected in honor of two Turkic princes, Kul Tigin and his brother Bilge Khagan.
